Key barriers to address?

- 1. Population and family planning have been largely left out of adaptation proposals and projects due to silo mindest
- 2. Low exposure of the policy makers and actors to understand the intrinsic linkage btn Population, Health, Gender and Climate/Enviornment
- 3. Policy and institutional frameworks support for integration
- 4. Decision makers and funding partners need to be convinced by evidence, good documentation and first hand experience
- Funding streams tend to be highly verticalized making scale up of integrated approaches harder
- 6. Low/No Adaptation and climate action engagement processes for integration of SRHR into responsive climate actions
